Over 80 CA CDA's attended the CDA National Convention in New Orleans, Louisiana. Several CA CDA Courts and your State Board were recognized for numerous National Awards and Recognitions. We all learned a lot about our CDA Organization, meeting up with old friends and making several new ones along the way. We have a new slate of National Officers and some new By-Laws that will be out in the upcoming publication of our National By-Laws which should be out before the end of the year. Please make sure your Court officers have a copy of the updated By-Laws.

One issue that was a topic of discussion at the National Convention was the update on the Robe Survey. The State Board hosted an informational Zoom session on this topic with over 52 attendees. A guick synopsis of the topic is as follows:

First off we are waiting for more direction from our National Board once they are able to meet and discuss the issue.

Secondly the issue ONLY applies to Local, State and National officers and District Deputies.

Thirdly the dress code, for officers and DD's, will be: White top, black skirt or pants and black shoes. All officers and DD's will have a medallion representing their positions. The cost of the medallion has yet to be determined but your Court should plan to have a budget line item to cover the costs of the medallions for your court.

The State Board would like to encourage all CA Courts to plan to purchase the medallions prior to the State Convention in April. Those Courts who process in wearing their medallions will have them all blessed as one group during the opening Mass of the Convention, on April 24th at 10:00 am at St. Charles Borromeo Church in Visalia. I am looking forward to participating in this beautiful historic event with all of our CA CDA Courts at the beautiful new St. Charles Borromeo Church. A new tradition for CDA receiving blessing at one of the state's newest Churches.

Good luck and Blessings on your new Court Year and make sure to let the State Board know of any of your Court's events and holiday activities. We would all love to try to join you.

Greetings CDA Sisters,

It was a pleasure to attend the National Convention in New Orleans and represent my Ct. #2400, Mary Queen of the World as their delegate. As your State Parliamentarian, I was able to see our National Parliamentarian in action as she guided the board on many voting issues. Copious notes

were taken as I thumbed rapidly through my own Rules book to check optional amendments. I was very proud of our State Regent who brought motions/amendments to the floor for discussion, and of our National Regent as she presided over the business meeting, not an easy task.

This brings us full circle to our Local Courts. Let me quote "Why do we hold business meetings? Simple...to get business done." For most local Courts, September brings a return to our local court meetings. There are some dos and don'ts explained in Robert's Rules to aid the Recording Secretary (RS) in their job. Often, a new RS will feel the pressure of writing down everything that is said. Some courts use recordings to assist the RS with recall to ensure the minutes have Motions written down correctly, and details of new business captured. When we were on zoom, the transcript feature was awesome! Yet, in person, it is important to remember "the RS is not a Stenographer. Ater all they are minutes NOT "seconds"!

1.<u>Do use the Agenda as your guide</u> and record the action taken for each item of business. Remember that the minutes support the creation of the next agenda for next month's meeting.

2. <u>Do enter the exact wording</u> of the final motion as agreed up by the vote. These are legal historical documents.

3. <u>Do record all vote types</u> Example: 4 Aye /6 Nay. An *abstention* does not count as any type of vote for recording purposes. It is sometimes seen as vote for the opposed. Do not record them. Or if it a 2/3rds required vote, write "passed by majority".

4. <u>Do not include the opinions or content from debate</u>. Listing opinions is not relevant to the decision that is ultimately passed or not passed.

5. <u>Do not spend a lot of time in passing the meeting minutes.</u> A formal amendment is not needed to change a grammatical error.

In the end, if you the RS are confused by a motion, members probably are, too. Remember, it is the Recording Secretary's job to clarify what details are to be included in the minutes and ask for clarity. It is the Regents role to repeat the motion verbatim prior to a vote.

Unity and Charity. Unity and Charity is the CDA motto and not unlike the church comprised of sinners who fall short of Christ's teaching, many in CDA fall short of its ideals. Many of us have asked, "Where was the unity and charity in that?" after an unpleasant encounter with another member.

Let us explore the word Unity

Unity The state of being one, or united; oneness; singleness. The quality of being one in spirit, sentiment, purpose, etc. Harmony; agreement; concord; uniformity.

Christian unity Christian unity as defined in the Bible, is a state of oneness, harmony, and love among believers in Jesus Christ. It is not mere uniformity, but a deep spiritual connection that reflects the relationship between God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

What is the meaning of true unity? Unity – universal oneness of God, man, and all creation. The only real unity is in Spirit. It is found nowhere else because personality always strives for its own success and aims for the good of the personal man, instead of all men.

What is the power of unity? The Power of Unity says we are all interconnected. The importance of connection and compassion are key tenets of Conscious Discipline. Connection is an essential impulse that is needed for survival. It keeps us in an optimal brain state that facilitates learning and problem-solving.

What did Jesus say about unity? The Savior prayed for unity among His disciples: "That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us." (John 17:21). The gospel creates a unity of faith with our Father, our Savior, and our fellow believers.

How does this apply to CDA? Unity, harmony and goodwill are virtues to be fostered and cherished. When united everyone respects each other and can be themselves. The Court should be a place where members are confident that they will not be gossiped about or disparaged. Members should feel safe to share honestly how they feel. Open communication is where everyone feels seen, heard, and included. By communicating like adults, we create a harmonious space for learning, growth, and strengthened relationships, paving the way for meaningful connections and shared progress.

We are human. We will make mistakes. We have different personalities and different styles. When broaching touchy subjects, it is always best to meet face to face or call. Texting and emails without voice nuances can add to the problem.

What destroys unity? Gossip. Egos. Jealousy. Cliques. Excluding others. Avoiding others. Micromanaging. Dictatorship. Closed doors. Members pushing their own agendas. Lack of communication. Miscommunication. Perception. Disrespect.

What are the consequences? Contention, discord, hurt feelings and members that shut down, do not share, stop going to meetings, or leave CDA. Contention can spread like poison, dividing us from those with whom we should be closest. Because the Spirit departs when discord erupts arguments can leave us floundering without the Lord's help and guidance. Slander is poison to the soul.

How CDA sisters should strive to be different. Initiating a conversation or asking a question should not be synonymous with conflict; rather, it should symbolize a pathway to resolution, understanding, and mutual growth. When we address issues, seek clarity, and strive for resolution, we embark on a journey of learning and development together.

Effective communication transcends arguments, emphasizing collaboration, empathy, and shared understanding. Let us embrace maturity in our interactions, fostering open dialogue, active listening, and constructive communication. Accept that your perception may be inaccurate.

Everyone can benefit by recognizing the difference between personal issues and business. Just because something is questioned, or someone has a difference of opinion should never be looked at as a personal attack. It is the opportunity to resolve things, get clarity, learn, and grow together.

We are all called to self-examination. We cannot change what we do not acknowledge. Acknowledging our shortcomings takes strength of character. The willingness to change takes courage and fortitude.

CDA is our opportunity to show the secular world how a true Christian can rise above pettiness, egos, and jealousy. To show how it looks to truly forgive, regroup, love one another, and move on.

Mother Teresa said it best, "In the end, it was never between you and the other person. It was always between you and God." In other words, the person you are gossiping about or talking about disparagingly.... is, in reality, you are attacking God.

The Our Father cautions us when we pray, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." God will forgive us in the same way we forgive others.

I belong to the Cultural Arts Rotary Club. In many ways, Rotary displays Christian principles based on a 4-way test. It is an ethical yardstick that reflects the high ethics and morals God would want in any organization:

Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the truth?
- 2. Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?
